The Catechumenate

When a person has decided to join the Catholic Church, he or she begins the Catechumenate. This begins with the Rite of Acceptance into the Order of Catechumens, which is often combined with a Rite of Welcoming for Candidates when there is a mixed group of the unbaptized and the already baptized.

This rite occurs at a Sunday Parish Liturgy. The catechumens proclaim their readiness to accept the Gospel, and candidates declare their intent to be received into full communion with the Catholic Church. The catechumens and candidates are signed with the sign of the cross as a sign of their readiness to bear witness to Christ with their whole lives. A bible or cross may be given. The period of the Catechumenate can last for months or even years. Catechumens are "brought to maturity" in the faith during this period through formal study of Church teaching, by a deeper commitment to living the Christian life, prayer, and by witness of their faith in the world. Catechumens are considered part of the church. If a catechumen dies, he or she is buried with Catholic Rites.

Catechumens are being formed to be members of the Body of Christ, and it is the responsibility of the entire parish, not just a few people, to participate in this formation through witness, support, and prayer.

Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary

**Masses on Aug. 14 at 7:00 PM
and Aug. 15th at 8:00 AM**

On the 15th day of August the church celebrates Mary's welcome to heaven. As we believe that Jesus was the first to rise, from the dead, so we believe he has also received his mother first into eternity. Eastern traditions called this event the "Dormition" or "sleeping" of Mary, indicating that she did not die but was taken to heaven as if asleep. Pope Pius XII declared the bodily assumption of Mary into heaven as a dogma of the church in 1950.

There are two Masses for solemnity; one for the vigil and another for the day.

Mary is a patron of Guatemala, Panama, and Paraguay under this title.
