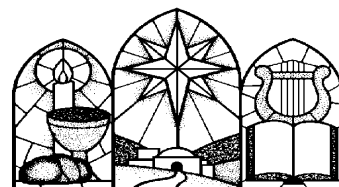
In the fullness of time, chosen in the unfathomable depths of God's wisdom, the Son of God took on himself our human nature in order to reconcile us with our Creator.
