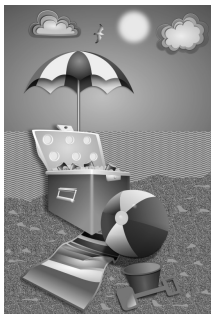
Mission Statement of St. Florian School

Year of Sacraments • One Word at a Time

Believe



We know that sacraments bring us in contact with Jesus and his saving mysteries, but how exactly does that happen? First, we must be clear that there is nothing automatic or mechanical about the sacraments. The sacraments, for example, are never imposed on us. In fact, the opposite is true. We can only celebrate and receive the sacraments with a free and loving act of faith.

At the end of Mark's Gospel, Jesus commissions his disciples to go into the whole world and proclaim the good news. Then he adds, "The one who **believes** and is baptized will be saved..." (Mark 16:16) From the very words of Jesus, we know the absolutely close link between faith and sacraments. Believers, people who have accepted the word of Jesus Christ proclaimed in the Church as true and who rely on that word, are the ones who celebrate and receive the sacraments. Then, in faith, the gifts and the graces of the sacraments take hold and change the lives of believers.

Año De Los Sacramentos • De Palabra En Palabra

Sabemos que los sacramentos nos ponen en contacto con Jesús y sus misterios salvíficos, pero ¿de qué manera sucede exactamente? En primer lugar, debemos tener en claro que no hay nada automático o mecánico acerca de los sacramentos; por ejemplo, nunca se nos imponen. De hecho, sucede todo lo contrario. Solo podemos celebrar y recibir los sacramentos mediante un acto libre de amor y fe.

Hacia el final del Evangelio de Marcos, Jesús les encarga a sus discípulos que vayan por todo el mundo a proclamar la Buena Nueva. Luego, añade: "Quien crea y se bautice se salvará" (Marcos 16:16). A partir de las palabras exactas de Jesús, conocemos el estrechísimo vínculo entre la fe y los sacramentos. Los creyentes, las personas que han aceptado la Palabra de Jesucristo proclamada en la Iglesia como verdadera y que confían en esa Palabra, son aquellas que celebran y reciben los sacramentos. Luego, en la fe, los dones y las gracias de los sacramentos se arraigan en la vida de los creyentes y la cambian.
